Introduction



However, seeing a dead ladybug in your house could indicate the untimely death of a family member.




Believed to be direct descendants of dinosaurs, it doesn't come as a surprise that several traditions see them as a symbol of adaptability and wisdom.


As they are often drawn to areas that need healing, their appearance could be trying to tell us that someone in the family requires both physical and spiritual cleansing.

PRAYING MANTIS




A popular omen of perception, stillness, and patience, a house visit from these observant creatures enables you to recognize and embrace fresh perspectives.
